Enhanced with numerous illustrations and photographs that bring the archaeological evidence to life, this exceptional work will be a valued resource for scholars, students, and general readers interested in the history of music, biblical studies, Jewish studies, and the cultures of the ancient Near East. This classic on space travel was first published in 1953, when interplanetary space flight was considered science fiction by most of those who considered it at all. Here the German-born scientist Wernher von Braun detailed what he believed were the problems and possibilities inherent in a projected

expedition to Mars. Today von Braun is recognized as the person most responsible for laying the groundwork for public acceptance of America's space program. When President Bush directed NASA in 1989 to prepare plans for an orbiting space station, lunar research bases, and human exploration of Mars, he was largely echoing what von Braun proposed in *The Mars Project*. Since the publication of the still very valuable *Biblioteca histórica de la filología* by Cipriano Muñoz y Manzano, conde de la Viñaza (Madrid, 1893), our knowledge of the history of the study of the Spanish language has grown considerably, and most manuscript and secondary sources had never been tapped before Hans-Josef Niederehe of the University of Trier courageously undertook the task to bring together any available bibliographical information together with much more recent research findings, scattered in libraries, journals and other places. The resulting *Bibliografía cronológica de la lingüística, la gramática y la lexicografía del español: Desde los principios hasta el año 1600 (BICRES)* began appearing in 1994. BICRES I covered the period from the early beginnings to 1600), followed by BICRES II (1601–1700), BICRES III (1701–1800), and together with Miguel Ángel Esparza Torres of Madrid there followed BICRES IV (1801 to 1860). Now, the fifth volume, has become available, covering the years from 1861 to 1899. Access to the bibliographical information of altogether 5,272 titles is facilitated by several detailed indexes, such as a short title index, a listing of printers, publishers and places of production, and an author index. More than twenty years of research in the major libraries of Spain and other European countries have gone into this unique work — relative sources of the Americas have also been covered — making it exhaustive source for any serious

scholar of any possible aspect of the Spanish language. The volume provides the first systematic comparative approach to the history of forms of address in Portuguese and Spanish, in their European and American varieties. Both languages share a common history—e.g., the personal union of Philipp II of Spain and Philipp I of Portugal; the parallel colonization of the Americas by Portugal and Spain; the long-term transformation from a feudal to a democratic system—in which crucial moments in the diachrony of address took place. To give one example, empirical data show that the puzzling late spread of Sp. usted ‘you (formal, polite)’ and Pt. você ‘you’ across America can be explained for both languages by the role of the political and military colonial administration. To explore these new insights, the volume relies on an innovative methodology, as it links traditional downstream diachrony with upstream diachronic reconstruction based on synchronic variation. Including theoretical reflections as well as fine-grained empirical studies, it brings together the most relevant authors in the field. The Jesuit Juan de Mariana (1535-1624) is one of the most misunderstood authors in the history of political thought. His treatise *De rege et regis institutione libri tres* (1599) is dedicated to Philip III of Spain. It was to present the principles of statecraft by which the young king was to abide. Yet soon after its publication, Catholic and Calvinist politiquers in France started branding Mariana a regicide. *De rege* was said to empower the private individual to kill a legitimate king. Its ‘pernicious doctrines’ were blamed for the murder of Henry IV in 1610, and it was burned at the order of the parlement of Paris. Modern historians have tended to build on this interpretation and consider *De rege* a stepping stone towards modern pluralist and democratic thought. Nothing

could be further from the truth. The notion of Mariana as an uncompromising theorist of resistance is in fact based on the distorted reading of a few select sentences from the first book of the treatise. This study offers a radical departure from the old view of Mariana as an early modern constitutionalist thinker and advocate of regicide. Thorough analysis of the text as a whole reveals him to be a shrewd and creative operator of political language as well as a champion of the church and bishops of Castile. The argument as a whole is informed by a Catholic-Augustinian view of human nature. Mariana's bleak, at times downright cynical view of man imparts focus and coherence to a text that challenges well established terminological boundaries and political discourses. In the first instance, his deeply pessimistic appraisal of human virtue justifies his disregard of positive law. He is thus able to mould diverse elements extracted from Roman and canon law, scholastic theology and humanist literature into a deliberately equivocal discourse of reason of state. Finally, this secular interpretation of the world of politics is cleverly yoked to a thoroughly clerical agenda of reform. In fact, reason of state is made to propagate an episcopal monarchy. *De rege* is exceptional in that it strings together a curious scholastic theory of the origins of society, a conservative ideology of absolute monarchy and a breathtakingly radical vision of theocratic renewal of Spanish government and society. *Juan de Mariana and Early Modern Political Thought* elucidates the differentiated nature of political debate in Habsburg Spain. It confirms the complexity of Spanish political life in the later sixteenth and early seventeenth century. Complementing recent work on Catholic political thought, the European reception of Machiavelli, and Spanish Habsburg government, this study

offers a more complete and holistic picture of early modern Spanish political culture. Fragen der Norm wurden für das Spanische bis weit ins 20. Unter den Vorzeichen der Globalisierung und der sich immer stärker etablierenden Konzeption der Plurizentrik teilt die Sprachakademie diese Rolle zunehmend mit neuen Akteuren. Neben den Akademien in Spanischamerika treten vor allem die Massenmedien auf dem Feld der spanischen Sprachkultur in Erscheinung. In Fragen praktischer Sprachkodifikation kooperieren sie systematisch mit den Sprachakademien, zugleich aber fordern sie diese heraus, indem sie den Sprachgebrauch der Hispanophonie jenseits von Sprachpolitik und Didaktik mit eigenen, massenkommunikativ vermittelten Normen prägen. Die Beiträge des Bandes beleuchten diesen Zusammenhang empirisch. Las cuestiones referentes a la norma del español, hasta bien entrado el siglo XX, se han resuelto exclusivamente en el seno de la Real Academia Española. Bajo los auspicios de la globalización y del pluricentrismo lingüístico, la Academia de la Lengua va compartiendo esta función con nuevos actores. Aparte de las Academias hispanoamericanas, estos son ante todo los medios de comunicación masiva. En la práctica de la codificación lingüística, dichos medios colaboran sistemáticamente con las Academias de la Lengua; al mismo tiempo que las desafían marcando el uso de la lengua mediante sus normas propias, más allá de la política lingüística y la enseñanza de la lengua. Las contribuciones reunidas en este volumen abren perspectivas teóricas, ideológicas y empíricas sobre este fenómeno.
