Several well-known incidents of poor judgement in timber harvesting methods on national forests in the United States did little to help the forester's image.

development of effective learning strategies that prepare learners for future learning. This dissertation contributes to the field of supporting concept mapping with designs of technological affordances, a process-based student model, an adaptive feedback tutor, empirical evaluations of these proposed innovations, and implications for future support in concept mapping.
