Among agents who opt into the program in the Selective-Mentoring branch, those who received mentorship had negligible performance gains. The difference between the two branches indicates that formal mentorship program treatment effects are largest for workers who would otherwise opt out of these programs. Demographic and personality characteristics are relatively weak predictors of selection into the program, suggesting broad-based programs are likely more effective than alternative targeting rules.

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
